

At the AGM, the entire team was voted back in, which I will take as a vote of appreciation and success, as stated before, we have a very experienced club executive and committee these last few years, of the now 7 of us, we have 2 air traffic controllers, 3 aerobatic instructors, 2 airline captains, 5 competition event organisers or Contest Directors, and 2 video and photographic enthusiasts. We are spread out around the world but due to technology, it shows we can all contribute.

Again, a big thanks to our teams that are the Event Organisers and Contest Directors. It is many hours of work and I ask you competitors to please help them out by getting your entries in early.

I live in Dubai and operate my Pitts out of Rangiora, we have a Northern team of Mike Slack and Grant Benns who are doing an awesome job of creating and running events at Mercer, and an enthusiastic Southern team of Andy Love, Lachlan Falconer and Mike Fowler putting together events at Ashburton. We use email and WhatsApp chats to share the workload and keep chipping away at projects, it's a great team to be part of.

The history of the winners is told by the trophies and we managed to track down all the trophies and have documented the names; we are trying to bring alive the interesting evolution of the competitor's history through the categories and planes. I want our history to reflect every competitor, organiser, judge and aircraft, not just the winners, and our events reports now reflect that.

I have compiled a fascinating history of all the aerobatic aircraft in New Zealand and especially those relevant to our club from the NZCivair website historians Dave Paull and Keith Morris; this is factual history including the good, the bad and the ugly, I promise I will post it soon.

We have a good list of all the cool aerobatic planes and current owners around the country, many of which are currently under repair or restoration and we are providing assistance and motivation to these owners to finish the project and come to our events sooner rather than later.

Our critical ground crew of volunteers is improving due to training weekends and the offer of a FREE LUNCH and offers of BEER, we still ask everyone to step up and help out with the roles on the ground, starter, spotter, judges, scribes, data entry. Please bring along a friend, girlfriend, wife, interested aviator wherever possible. We have an easy description of the role to assist and none of the roles are too difficult. If you know someone who may be interested to help, let us know and get in touch with them, tell them we can provide BEER. For the scribes and judges, we plan to standardise the shorthand remarks and comments and write a training page for you too.

Our Mentor Mentality is growing. We are planning to add mentor assistance to our website. I did not have any aviation mentor in my early career and I now try to fill these gaps for those following, to provide encouragement, to help where I can, to pay it forward where possible and even up to let people I have come to know to fly my cool plane. We are trying to spread this philosophy and encourage all of you with some experience, to take one or two under your wing and help them develop faster than they would on their own, if possible, let them fly your aircraft until they can get their own and stay in touch to provide motivation and encouragement wherever possible. Thank you again to the current crop of generous aircraft owners, David Cranna, Adam Butcher, Andy Love, Fred Zayas, who like me, share their toys.

We hope you continue to grow through your experience and abilities in aerobatics and hence move up to more capable aircraft, we also hope the aerobatic aircraft in NZ do not get lost offshore. Aircraft Syndicates are a great way to get into flying really cool planes at a reasonable cost, look around your area for like minded guys who may be able to go shares in an aerobatic aircraft with you. There are currently quite a few options, A Zlin 50, Lazer 230, and 4-5 Pitts S1 or projects currently available for purchase (KEM, MPM, PEG, JNW & JFD) if you are keen to join the growing group of us that realise the great bang for buck and just great fun these aircraft are, contact me for more info. It will be great to get these aircraft flying again. I have purchased Factory built Pitts S1S; ZK-PPS as a restoration project to be syndicated in Canterbury if you are interested in getting started.

THE 2023 NZAC NATIONALS

We wrapped up a very successful Nationals due to excellent weather and a full team of organisers and volunteers that allowed us to really share the workload and progress efficiently through all the flights. Grant Benns as Event Organiser with Morris Tull and Andy Love as Contest Directors.

Cloudy weather for many to get to and from the event meant the best weather was in the middle of our week for a change. Most arrived a day early, we had plenty of people, a rented van and Noel's 4-wheel drive car to get the box markers out and we managed to get everyone some practice time in the box before starting on schedule Wednesday afternoon.

A huge thanks to our outside volunteers; Noel Kinvig, Marina, Gillian Phillips, Murray Callister and Richard Wallace plus our own Simone Barry and Kym Tull helping with great food. Lawrence Robinson and Mike Fowler were awesome with their efforts on the judge line, media content, IT expertise and live scoring system.

We secured the large Aeroworks hangar close to our activity and got all the other fragile aircraft in a hanger somewhere. We made contact with the local authorities which generated a visit by the Masterton Fire department and Richard gave us an excellent, hands-on firefighting training session using dry powder extinguishers on fuel fires, fortunately we did not need to use this training at the event.

Midweek we had the Club AGM, which was short enough to be interesting and covered some good stuff. The entire committee was voted back in as a testament to a job well done over the year and as President, it was a pleasure working with this team.

Our Supplementary Information, airfield NOTAM and local operator warning notice did the job with excellent coordination of the arrivals of a citation jet, Life flight medical plane and low-level survey work by a helicopter with a huge deep water survey sensor slung below the helicopter. Unbelievably, nobody told us they were going to dismantle the Avgas pump for half a day in the middle of our flying!

Excellent lunches were prepared by Kiri from Mumma Darla's Pantry and she also catered our prizegiving dinner. Pizzas fed us one night and Kym and Simone and Des catered and cooked Thursday night.

Andy Love and Grant Benns managed the judging line brilliantly with Andy scheduling the flights. Unfortunately, Brent Griffin's G202 had a hard-to-find electrical issue that ultimately stopped it flying in the competition and Brent and Morris missed out on their comp in NUT.

The competition flights flowed very well with some great flying and close scores and competitors in every category except primary. To help everyone know what sequence is being flown by other pilots, we published the sequences being flown each day by everyone on the WhatsApp group and this added to the enjoyment of being a spectator.

It is always inspiring to watch Russell Bell fly Unlimited in his G200 if you can keep up with his sequence, well done Russell. Andy Love showed his extra practice and a well refined Free Known sequence to beat Morris Tull in Advanced in Andy's first season in this category. Steve Geard did well this year, first by getting there, with trousers, and had clearly done plenty of practice. Close scoring between Steve and David Cranna in his beautiful Extra 330LX, both aircraft are a pleasure to watch and listen to.

Sports category was the most popular with 9 competitors, many first timers and some new aircraft, well done everyone. Dave Wilkinson Buzzed his way around the box, Pierre Pechon handled the Decathlon increasingly well through the week, Des Barry smiled his way through the comp in Mo's Pitts, Grant Benns and Dave Cranna flew the RV7 gracefully well, Ross Brodie put in solid scores in Andy's Pitts. Lincoln Jones and his shiny new Pitts S2C impressed the judges with great scores, then there is Murray Rogers who tactfully took a few breaks and consistently positioned his CT4B to score very well. Chris Schadler has clearly been listening to all the good advice, putting the practice in and he guided his RV3 to a high score of 86.15% and dominance over the category, very nice work Chris. We expect many of you to move up a category next year based on these results.

In Recreational, Pierre Pechon flew the Decathlon well to score 75% in his first proper comp and he gain much valuable experience, welcome Poots!

The Unlimited, Advanced and Intermediate pilots plus other interested pilots had a fun session designing their Free Unknowns on Thursday.

Among the Unknown flights, Ross Brodie flew well to score 84.8% and take out the Sports Unknown trophy and Alan Hogan Unknown trophy. The Champion of Champion Trophy goes to the highest percentage score and was deservedly won by Chris Schadler which is quite appropriate as he has won every trophy in the season in this class.

The 4-minute Freestyle had 5 competitors signed up for it but no-fly weather on Saturday squashed that and only Morris Tull and Andy Love managed to get a flight in under the cloud on Sunday with Morris edging ahead by 0.5% to take the Freestyle Trophy home again.

Saturday was low cloud but we were treated to a 2 hour visit and guided tour through The Vintage Aviator hangar of World War One aircraft, it is such an awesome collection. Following that, we had Simone's brother; David Hawkins; who works on development of space probes to the Moon Europa, gave a fascinating presentation on the technology and information on space flight. Later that evening we had a great presentation dinner with awesome food from Kiri.

Sunday was rain and low cloud over the country so many headed home late morning and all arrived home safely to conclude an awesome event, many thanks to all.










A 2 ½ day training weekend was held in Ashburton over the weekend of 27th to 29th May 2022. The intent of the training weekend was to provide the opportunity for NZAC members to get some critiquing, provide training of new judges and scribes plus expose those interested in aerobatics the chance to experience flying upside down with an instructional trail flight.

Friday was predominately critiquing for our club members. Andrew Love provided two briefings, the first on "What the Judges are looking for" and the second on "Using OpenAero". A number of new attendees joined in to observe and to have a go on the judging line to see how things operate.

Saturday was the busiest day with Lachlan Falconer presenting "An Introduction to Judging and Scribing." This was followed by attendee pilots flying in the box to provide the new judges (9-10 peoples) with an opportunity to apply their new skills. This proved to be of great value. After the training session, John Lamont provided a short brief on the requirements for obtaining an LLDA. This was followed by a presentation by Mike Fowler on his experience of "His first competition".
